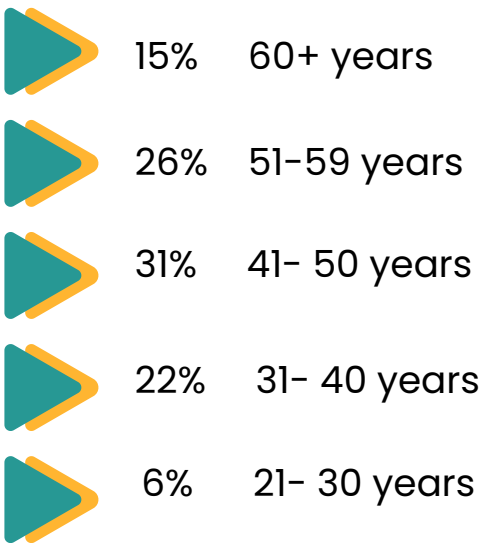

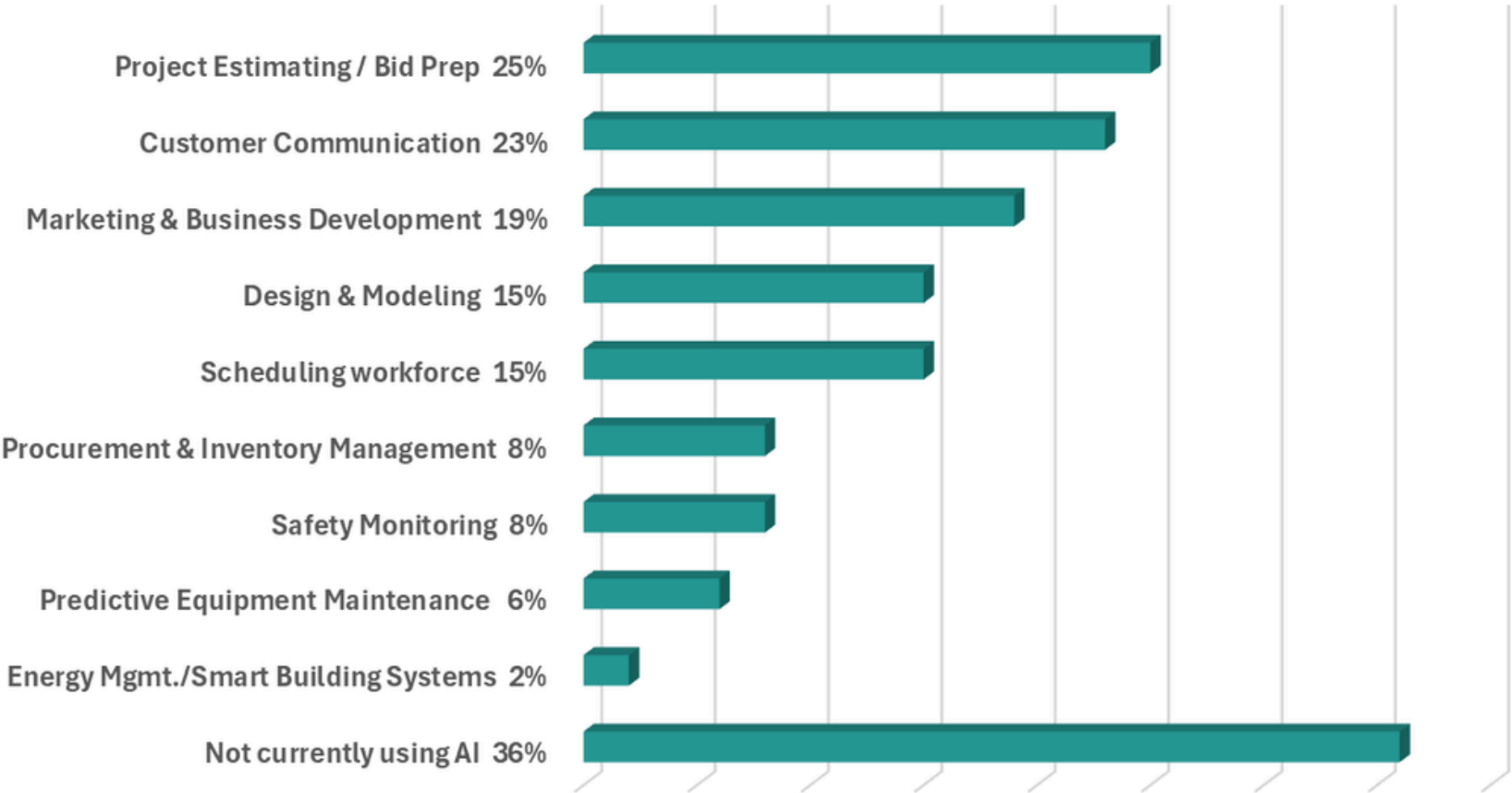
SIZE OF ATTENDING FIRM

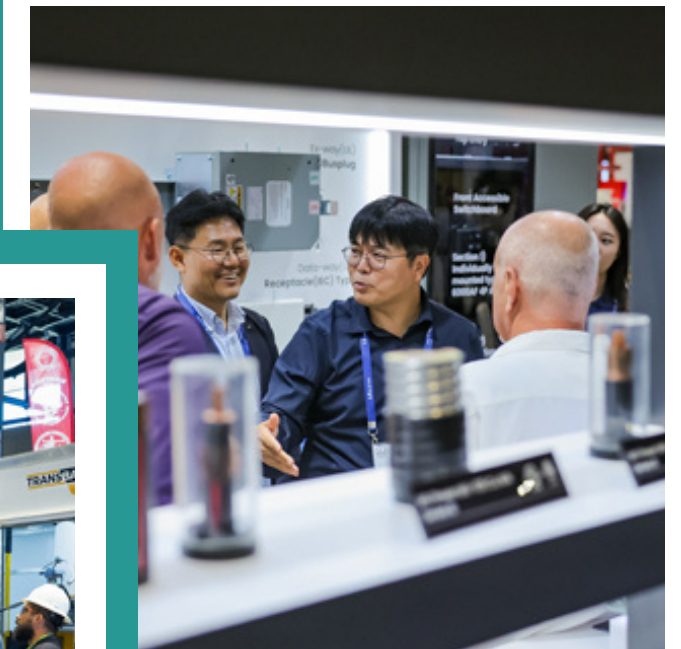

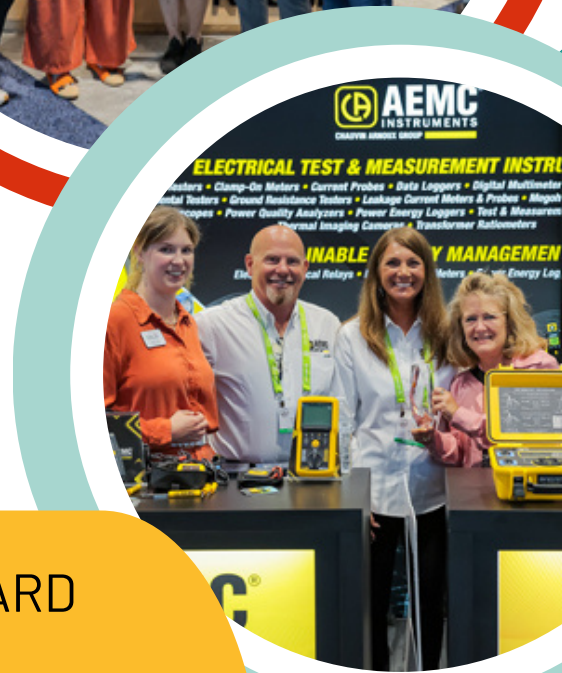
